

LESSON PLAN

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Internet safety – tips to stay safe online

<p>Target audience: 7th grade primary school students aged 12-13 A2 level</p>	<p>Duration: 2 lessons (2 x 45 min)</p>
<p>Lesson Aims:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• To develop students' awareness of staying safe online• To develop students' listening and speaking skills	
<p>Skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• listening• speaking• writing <p>Learners will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• brainstorm ideas and tips how to stay safe online• watch a video about online safety tips• discuss the video and suggest their own tips for staying safe online• discuss the importance of a strong password• create a poster about online safety tips and strong passwords	<p>Desirable Outcomes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will learn the importance and useful tips of staying safe online• Students will learn the importance of strong passwords and how to create them to protect their personal information online
<p>Technical Vocabulary: online safety, the Internet, personal information, password, username, privacy settings, posts, security, social media, Facebook, cyber rules, Bee Secure website</p>	
<p>Preparation and materials:</p> <p>British Council Learn English Teens video: Online safety tips http://learnenglishteens.britishcouncil.org/uk-now/video-uk/online-safety-tips</p> <p>Bee-Secure website: https://pwdtest.bee-secure.lu/?lang=en</p> <p>Card paper, crayons, glue, scissors, and other materials needed for making a poster</p>	

Activities:

- students brainstorm some ideas and tips about online safety
- students watch a video about online safety tips and make notes
- teacher checks comprehension by asking some questions related to the video, and students discuss some interesting parts of the video
- students work in pairs and try to think of some new and useful tips for online safety
- students discuss the new tips with the rest of the class
- teacher tells the students about the importance of having a strong password to protect personal information online and some advice how to make their passwords stronger
- students discuss strong passwords and test their password strength by using Bee Secure website
- students work in groups and create different posters about online safety tips and strong passwords
- students display their posters and discuss them with their classmates

Plenary:

Students will discuss online safety, share their ideas with other classmates, and make posters.

Assessment opportunities

Students will display their posters, discuss and assess them with other students.

Progression – what could pupils do next?

Students could create a video or a presentation about online safety and strong passwords and share them with the other students at school.
